Project Name: Dorchester County Broadband Expansion Project

Many of the project areas proposed by Charter within Dorchester County are either served or in the process of being served with ARPA funding from Dorchester County. As noted in the attached press release from Dorchester County (labeled as Exhibit A), Dorchester County recently awarded a total of \$17.1 million in a public-private partnership to build fiber-to-the-home broadband in separate areas of western Dorchester County. The attached map (labeled as Exhibit B) demonstrates where the Dorchester County projects are compared to Charter's SFRF application. Shapefiles can be provided upon request.

Construction in this area is already underway.

Approximately 95% of the census blocks within Charter's application are scheduled for completion by the end of 2024 under the currently funded projects.

The approval of Charter's application for these census blocks means this area will be overbuilt with funding that could be used in other unserved areas of rural South Carolina. Since the majority of these census blocks will be served under Dorchester County's ARPA funding, any remaining isolated residents may best be served by the ORS' Last Mile Grant Program.
