2.3 - Additional Information

If the proposed Project is in an area that is subject to an existing federal or state funding commitment for reliable speeds of 100/20 Mbps, explain why there was an identified need for additional broadband investment that was not met by existing federal or state funding commitments.

The applicant acknowledges there is overlap of RDOF areas with the proposed project area. However, the proposed project area was in dire need of broadband services and additional broadband investment was needed to get the much-needed services to the locations at a quicker pace than that allowed under the RDOF funding. Specifically, RDOF broadband deployment obligations are to serve 40% by the end of the 3rd year, 60% by the end of the 4th year, 80% by the end of the 5th year, and the final locations by the end of the 6th year. This means the locations that were lacking broadband and unable to remotely attend school, telework, and or access telehealth could have been without much needed access to broadband until 2028. Conversely the applicant, has already self-funded 100% of the broadband fiber infrastructure in the application area. Residential and business customers in this area can now receive 1Gbps symmetrical over fiber facilities.
