This concerns your Freedom of Information Act request of June 16, 2023 for documentation and correspondence related to EPA consultations with the Department of Energy and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission in the development of “New Source Performance Standards for Greenhouse Gas Emissions From New, Modified, and Reconstructed Fossil Fuel-Fired Electric Generating Units; Emission Guidelines for Greenhouse Gas Emissions From Existing Fossil Fuel-Fired Electric Generating Units; and Repeal of the Affordable Clean Energy Rule,” proposed rule.

Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 2.104 (e), an extension of the due date is necessary due to unusual circumstances. EPA needs additional time to search for and review a voluminous amount of records and consult with other agency offices that have a substantial interest in the responsive information. The new estimated due date of your request is November 3, 2023.
