Cogeco US (SC), LLC, d/b/a Breezeline (formerly Atlantic Broadband), has been doing business in Aiken County since 2007. The scope of this project is to extend our network into Eastern Aiken County to serve 100% of locations in 12 Red High Priority K-12 areas and 6 Pink Unserved areas across a total of 18 census blocks. The total passings to be served includes 673 locations, which includes 661 homes, 5 businesses, 2 fire stations, 4 churches and 1 school. This project will ensure that residents and businesses have access to quality, affordable broadband service that can meet their current and future needs, including online learning, remote work, and access to state-of-the-art telehealth. The proposed 61.15 mile project is a Fiber-to-the Home ("FTTH") deployment using Gigabit Passive Optical Network ("GPON") architecture to deliver fiber to each location. The proposed network has been designed to be scalable and expandable to meet future needs as new locations are built within the project area and as end-user demands require higher bandwidth connections.

Describe how your proposal meets the needs of the community to be served as described in the "Guidelines."

Breezeline's broadband service will improve the quality of life for locations that are unserved. Access to high-speed internet is critical for education, employment, economic development, governmental services, entrepreneurship, tourism, telehealth services, communication, commerce, entertainment, public safety, and other essential services. Breezeline's commitment to building out passive optical networks ("PON") as the underpinnings of FTTH ensures any emerging consumer or business applications can be delivered reliably for years to come.

This expansion will extend broadband to 100% of the 673 locations in a total of 18 CBGs which includes 5 businesses, 2 fire stations, 4 churches and 1 school. This project will ensure that residents and businesses have access to quality, affordable broadband service that can meet their current and future needs, including online learning, remote work, and access to state-of-the-art telehealth. To assist in closing the digital divide, Breezeline provides broadband connectivity at discounted prices for financially struggling households through the Federal Communications Commission's Affordable Connectivity Program ("ACP") Program. FTTH architecture is a critical element to serve not only residences but schools, libraries, hospitals, retailers and other businesses in the area. Fiber offers not only high bandwidth and low latency but also high reliability. Fiber is ideal for businesses and anchor institutions that depend on the internet to operate. This fiber infrastructure is what allows businesses to be able to locate and expand in rural communities.

The proposed project area includes 11 census blocks that have been awarded federal funding in the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") Rural Digital Opportunity Fund ("RDOF") Phase 1 Auction to CCO Holdings. The census blocks are as follows: 450030219022003, 450030219022007, 450030219022013, 450030219022015, 450030219022018, 450030219022019, 450030219022020, 450030219022021, 450030219022042, 450030219022043 and a very small portion of 450030219022022. (3 homes out of 72). Breezeline has to build through these Census Blocks inorder to reach the unserved High Priority Census Blocks.
