Tri-County Electric Cooperative is a member-owned cooperative providing electric service to more than 18,000 residential, agricultural, commercial, and industrial electric members in South Carolina. In 2020, Tri-County initiated a 3-year fiber deployment project to build an advanced communications network capable of deploying smart-grid technologies and fiber-to-the-home(FTTH) broadband services to its members. As of today, Tri-County has completed construction of its initial project to build over 1,500 miles of mainline fiber and provide fiber to home service availability to 100% of its membership. The project was completed 1 year ahead of schedule and has already connected over 5,000 FTTH broadband customers to its network. This fiber network is currently available to all Cooperative members located in Calhoun, Richland, Lexington, Orangeburg, Kershaw and Sumter Counties. Broadband service is provided through Tri-County's subsidiary TriCoLink. TriCoLink provides local customer service with employees based within the service area. All customers of TriCoLink are able to receiver 1Gbs symmetrical service no matter their location. In reviewing the unserved and underserved census blocks in the ARPA application TriCoLink is positioned to utilize the current fiber back bone and expand services to these areas. Due to the recent investment of the fiber back bone TriCoLink will be able to construct this expansion of its existing infrastructure faster and more economical than other providers.

Describe how your proposal meets the needs of the community to be served as described in the "Guidelines."

TriCoLink, Inc. provides fiber to the home with our lowest package being 100Mbps symmetrical and our largest package 1Gbps symmetrical, with no data caps or speed throttling. TriCoLink, Inc. has enterprise grade solutions and is working towards being an open carrier.

If the proposed Project is in an area that is subject to an existing federal or state funding commitment for reliable speeds of 100/20 Mbps, explain why there is an identified need for additional broadband investment that is not met by existing federal or state funding commitments.

TriCoLink, Inc. may build through an existing federal or state funded area to provide service to a Priority Unserved area. However, we do not plan to serve these areas already funded just pass through.

For more than 80 years Tri-County Electric Cooperative Inc, owner of TriCoLink, has served the rural areas of South Carolina. Through this dedication of service and commitment to our communities the Cooperative has become a trusted partner for the citizens of these communities. As the ISP subsidiary of Tri-county, TriCoLink will partner with civic organizations, faith communities, and governmental bodies to promote the value of fiber to the home service. We will also be conducting public sign-up days in the local communities. Our employees will become fiber ambassadors that provide information and assistance through the sign-up process. It is the mission of TriCoLink and Tri-County to have everyone linked to fiber by TriCoLink.

Describe any plans or programs you have developed to improve adoption in the community described in this proposal.

As part of the Project, explain how the Applicant will make efforts to increase digital literacy, for example, support through online training?

Tri-County Electric Cooperative has been a part of these communities for over 80 years. We were the first to provide power to many of these rural areas when other utilites refused. This commitment to the community has allowed the Cooperative to build strong grass rooots connections within the community. Tri-County Electric Cooperative, throught it's subsidiary, TriCoLink, plans to provide necessary education about the benefits of fiber, we plan to publish articles in 'SC Living Magazine' which is provided free of charge to 15,000 residences within our service area. We will also be conduction training seminars utilizing community meeting facilities and our auditorium located in St. Matthews.
