If not, (i) when can Applicants expect an update, and (ii) will Applicants be permitted to update their election from letter of credit to performance bond if there is an update?</p>	<p>The SCBBO is not issuing funding on a time-based reimbursable basis, therefore the ISP will be required to obtain a LOC for 25% of the subaward amount or a performance bond for 100%, which can be reduced as the subgrantee hits predefined deployment milestones. Additional guidance is forthcoming from the NTIA.</p>
Pre-Qualification/Gating Applic	<p>For the Sec. 11.1 (BABA) certification stating that, "The Applicant understands and is committed to comply with the use of the U.S. Department of Commerce's cleared vendor list," we would like to confirm that the certification is in line with the NTIA's stated intent that we use / reference the cleared vendor list, but that we are not required to use vendors exclusively from the list. Is that correct, and if not, what are the requirements for using the cleared vendor list?</p>	<p>Correct. The Applicant needs to make sure that their choice of vendor is compliant with all BABA requirements. The Department of Commerce Office of Acquisition Management (OAM) has published a self-certification list of companies that have certified certain equipment they sell meets the domestic manufacturing requirements enumerated in the BABA waiver for the BEAD Program and can be considered compliant with the Buy America preference. If using a vendor not on the list, the applicant is required to ensure their choice of vendor is compliant with all BABA requirements.</p>
GIS Data	<p>Would it be feasible to send out a list of which ZCTAs are affected when new GIS files are sent out? We add these files to our in-house map. This would let us know if we actually needed to upload the new files or if we can continue our planning from the current files. Thanks</p>	<p>The SCBBO does not intend to create and publish a separate file indicating which ZCTAs are affected based on new enforceable commitments; however, this data can be readily ascertained by ISPs in reviewing the latest version of BSL's, which will be published by the SCBBO. Prospective Applicants will need to ensure they use the latest version of eligible BSL's published by the SCBBO in developing their proposed project(s) in anticipation of the BEAD Main Application Phase by downloading the revised data from Citrix.</p>

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Pre-Qualification/Gating Applic	If two companies are approaching BEAD as a Joint Venture, do they both have to submit a pre-qualification - or - can they both be named in a single prequalification and have subawards via the actual application?	<p>The South Carolina Pre-Qualification allows applicants to identify if they are applying as a joint venture in Section 1.4. If the joint venture involves a newly created legal entity, this new entity should submit for Pre-Qualification. If the joint venture does not involve a new legal entity or the new entity has not been formed yet, each company must be gated through Pre-Qualification separately.</p> <p>The subawards will be made with the Applicant listed in the Main Application. The legal entity(s) named as the Applicant will be required to provide a Letter of Credit or Performance Bond. If selected, the Applicant will be awarded the funding, will be expected to manage and complete the work, and will serve as the culpable party. The Applicant should be the entity that seeks to be awarded the funding, manage and complete the work.</p>
Pre-Qualification/Gating Applic	Can a potential application/subgrantee use their Parent Company's Consolidated Audit, with the consolidating sheets showing the applicant/subgrantee's financials for the prequalification and BEAD application. (applicant/subgrantee understands that after awarded BEAD they would need to have their own Single-Audit going forward)	<p>Financial statements can be provided at the parent level. Applicants must submit either (1) audited financial statements for the prior fiscal or calendar year or (2) unaudited financial statements with a certification that the Applicant will provide audited financial statements by the time of the Main Application is submitted.</p> <p>A consolidated audit includes the financial information of a parent company and its subsidiaries into a single financial view of the entity. Per CFR.200.501, a non-Federal entity that expends \$1,000,000 or more in Federal awards during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year must have a single audit conducted in accordance with § 200.514.</p> <p>As part of the South Carolina BEAD Main Application, Applicants who receive awards will need to submit a letter of credit or a performance bond for a portion of the award value. As noted in the question, the Applicant/Subgrantee would need to have their own Single-Audit going forward if they meet the 2 CFR 200 threshold of spending federal award dollars within a fiscal year.</p>
Pre-Qualification/Gating Applic	If the applicant has subsidiaries that will not be involved in the application or the grant project, do we still need to provide information on those subsidiaries?	At the time of the Pre-Qualification, the Applicant is required to share information about all subsidiaries regardless of broadband involvement when uploading an organizational chart (Section 3.2) and listing the percentage of ownership in other companies (Section 7.2). Applicants may be required to submit additional information about subsidiaries' broadband awards at the time of the Main Application.
Pre-Qualification/Gating Applic	If submitting multiple pre-qualification applications, is it permissible to use the audit report of the parent company at this time or would you rather submit individual company financials? If you want individual company financials, do you want them as of 12/31/2023 or as of 11/30/2024?	Yes, it is permissible to use the audit report of the parent company at this time. Applicants should submit available audited financials, whether those are at the parent or subsidiary level. Applicants are able to submit audited financials for either the previous fiscal or calendar year. It is important to remember that audited financials comprise only one aspect of the Financial Capability requirement for BEAD. As part of the South Carolina BEAD Main Application, Applicants who receive awards will need to submit a letter of credit or a performance bond for a portion of the award value. In most instances, the Applicant will only submit one Pre-Qualification application as this phase acts as gating. Applicants are able to apply to multiple ZCTAs during the Main Application.

No, the information should be provided in the table format of the Section 7 Ownership tab because of the supplemental information required for each response (e.g., Address for parties with 10% or more ownership interest, citizenship status). At the time of Pre-Qualification, the Applicant is required to share information about all subsidiaries regardless of broadband involvement when submitting an organizational chart attachment (Section 3.2).

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GIS Data	We are partnered with an ISP and do not hold a Cost Quest License but feel that we should be the ones applying for the grants since we build out the fiber network. Can we use our ISP Partner's Cost Quest License to view maps and data in order to participate in BEAD?	The NTIA Tier D license supports the distribution of Licensed Materials to a Licensee's Authorized Users. An Authorized User may be a subcontractor or contractor working on the Licensee's behalf to support the licensed purposes. The use of the Licensed Materials by the Authorized Users must be in support of the Licensee's intent and consistent with the terms of the license agreement. A tier D licensee can publish availability information (location_id and broadband coverage information) with other Licensees. Please consult the terms of your ISP Partner's Cost Quest license for additional details.
GIS Data	Currently in the Maps and Data there are locations that we serve, have served for quite a while and have been submitted during BDC submissions. How do we go about getting these off of the map so that funds are not wasted?	The BEAD Challenge Process has been completed. NTIA does not allow the SCBBO to make additional changes to the eligibility data, unless an enforceable commitment occurs wherein a BSL is, or is expected to be, served by an ISP.
Pre-Qualification/Gating Applic	For the pre-qualification, are you locked into your choice of a letter of credit versus a bond? Can you select letter of credit for the pre-qualification and change to a bond for the main application?	Applicants may choose to shift their financing between the Letter of Credit (LOC) or a Bond between the Pre-Qualification phases and Main Application phases respectively. However, the applicant cannot shift financing once the Main Application phase has closed. To the extent there are any changes to the information provided in the Pre-Qualification Grant Application, data, and associated attachments prior to any award, Applicant must disclose the changes and provide updated versions of the relevant changes within 5 business days to the ORS.

The example provided represents an Availability Challenge, the SCBBO will evaluate evidentiary proof on a case by case basis. A lack of proof (i.e. hearsay) may result in your challenge being rejected.

However, it is not explicit that Code 71 covers cellular fixed wireless. So does cellular fixed wireless fall under 71 and therefore, is underserved? Thanks.</p>	<p>The SCBBO approved Volume I states: The SCBBO will treat locations which the National Broadband Map shows to have available qualifying broadband service (i.e., a location that is "served") due solely to the availability of Cellular Fixed Wireless Access (CFWA) as "underserved." As a result, the SCBBO initiated the pre-challenge modification to designate all Cellular-based fixed wireless service as underserved.</p>

To challenge a location from unserved or underserved to served a registered user must submit a planned service challenge with substantial evidence as well as uploading the required template to the entity's designated Citrix ShareFile folder to show that the location has or will have service by June 30th, 2024.</p>
BEAD Challenge Portal	<p>The evidence type for Planned Service has listed: "Construction contracts or similar evidence of ongoing deployment, along with evidence that all necessary permits have been applied for or obtained. Contracts or a similar binding agreement between the Eligible Entity and the provider stating that planned service will meet the BEAD definition and requirements of reliable and qualifying broadband, even if not required by its funding source (i.e., a separate federal grant program), including the expected date when deployment will be completed, which must be on or before June 30, 2024."</p> <p>What is the required evidence example for a location that has existing service available that is not currently reflected in the availability data? There would not be a construction contract available for locations with already existing service. Will a screenshot from a provider webpage proving availability of service meet the evidence file requirement?</p>	<p>Evidence documenting that a location currently has reliable broadband service can include the examples listed in the different service level challenges as outlined in the user guide. In addition, the evidence submitted must be tied to the location and up to date. Challengers should provide as much evidence as possible per location.</p>

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General BEAD Question	<p>Which challenge type “Planned Service or Enforceable Commitment” should a service provider use to challenge the unserved BSL’s if the locations have access to fiber due to a funded project that was just completed or will have access once a funded project is completed, if the BSL’s were not included in the funded project for such reasons as the BSL’s were on the opposite side of the road from a funded census block or the service provider built through non-funded blocks to get to funded blocks? GIS mapping data, including geo tagged photos, by itself will not be sufficient evidentiary proof for a challenge. Examples of evidence needed is outlined in the user guide under the planned service and service level challenges.</p>

BEAD Challenge Portal	<p>We have many BEAD eligible locations that fall within the project area of our CPF grant award. At the time CPF was awarded, these locations were not considered eligible for funding. Now they are. Can we challenge these as an enforceable commitment since they will be completed as part of our CPF grant project? We could amend our CPF application to add these BSLs to our required locations with no change to the funding amount.</p>	<p>The BEAD Challenge Process has been completed. However, the SCBBO will continue to seek out opportunities to fund deployment projects throughout the State using any remaining funds available under alternate funding sources (e.g. ARPA SLFRF, ARPA CPF, State Funds, etc.) and ensure service to eligible locations. Therefore, the SCBBO reserves the right to remove broadband serviceable locations from eligibility under another enforceable commitment.</p>

When the Main Application Phase opens, prospective applicants will submit based on 2020 Census ZCTAs attributed by the using this field. Prospective applicants <b><u>WILL NOT SUBMIT</u></b> based on the Zip Code field attributed by FCC/Cost Quest because they could be different. Applicants may also choose to use the ZCTA GIS layer to ensure a full representation of eligible BSL's that are known for each project area.
General Bead Question	Are all schools showing as BEAD eligible	No. Per NTIA requirements, only schools which do not have access to 1Gbps symmetric are eligible.
General Bead Question	Will BEAD updates be available on the SC website or just in Citrix?	Program documents will be updated on the ORS BEAD page; however, location data (GIS DATA) will only be updated on Citrix.
General Bead Question	At the beginning of the year I downloaded and organized all of the BEAD documentation. Have any of the documents been changed? Should I re-download?	The state's BEAD Initial Proposal Volume II was last updated on August 20, 2024 and that version was approved by NTIA on September 20, 2024. To avoid confusion, it is highly recommended Applicants revisit the BEAD page and re-download all files available.
General Bead Question	Is there a timeframe when the eligible address dataset will not be changed afterwards?	At NTIA's direction, the SCBBO may continue to make enforceable commitments under existing programs up until the start of the Main Application Phase. Therefore, the South Carolina <b><u>BEAD Eligibility Data is subject to change until such time the main application phase commences.</u></b>
General Bead Question	How should companies handle the prequalification of their affiliates? Does each affiliate need to prequalify individually, or can a single prequalification apply to all affiliates? (an operating company held by a parent company).	The final award will be made with the applicant. The applicant may be a parent company, a subsidiary, or one or more of its affiliates. Current guidance does not explicitly state that entities should apply at the parent, subsidiary, or affiliate level. However, BEAD NOFO Section IV.D.2.b requires that the applicant must submit an organizational chart detailing all parent, subsidiaries, and affiliates. Each entity must report its ownership structure and comply with Title 47. Prospective applicants must remember that BEAD NOFO Section IV.D.2.e requires the provision of a Letter of Credit when considering to apply at the parent, subsidiary, or affiliate level. If an affiliate anticipates that it will enter into a grant agreement, be awarded the funding, be expected to manage and complete the work, and will serve as the culpable party supporting the overall project, then the affiliate should be the applicant. Likewise, if the parent company anticipates that it will be awarded the funding, be expected to manage and complete the work, and will hold the liability, then the parent company should apply. Also, the applicant must have an active UEI number and no exclusionary records on sam.gov and a vendor number with the State of South Carolina.
General Bead Question	Has the Challenge data been approved by NTIA?	Yes. The BEAD Map Challenge data has been approved by the NTIA.

Once the Main Application Phase opens, the NTIA prohibits the SCBBO from making additional enforceable commitments to the BEAD eligible locations. The SCBBO anticipates the main application phase period will last approximately 45 days leaving time for Applicants to make any necessary adjustments to their proposed projects.



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General Bead Question	What if a provider comes through hanging fiber while we are in the middle of the application and we find out after we've already checked out the areas on foot?	Once the Main Application phase opens, the NTIA requires that all BEAD-eligible points are frozen. Therefore, based on NTIA guidance, the locations remain eligible for BEAD funding.
General Bead Question	As it refers to affiliates, does the isp have to apply?	The term "affiliate," per the BEAD NOFO, refers to a person that (directly or indirectly) owns or controls, is owned or controlled by, or is under common ownership or control with, another person.
