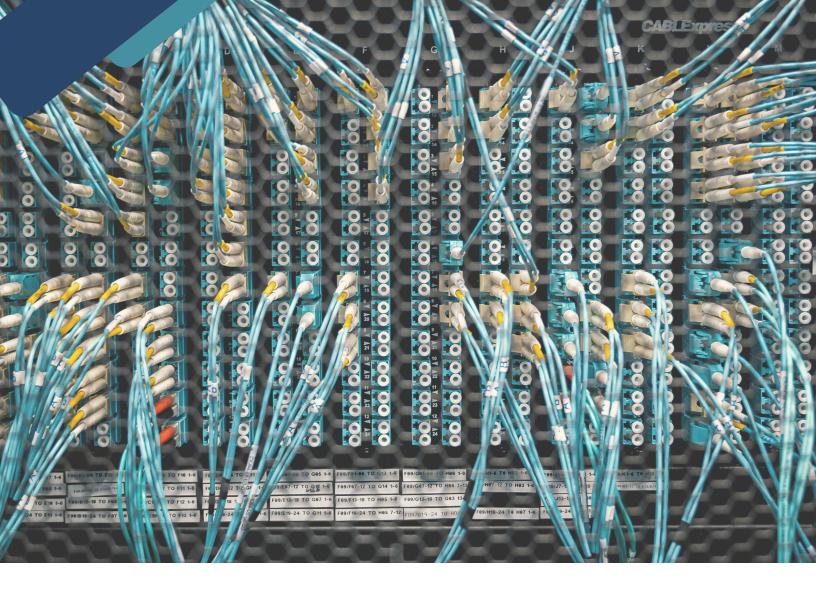

Executive Summary 2024-2025

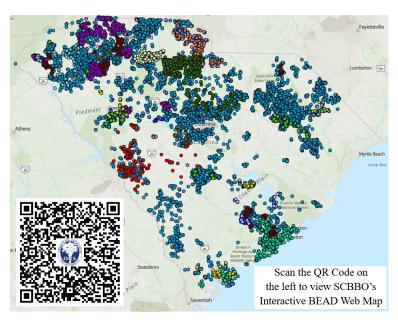
The South Carolina Broadband Office (SCBBO), part of the Office of Regulatory Staff (ORS), presents its annual report to the South Carolina General Assembly. This report summarizes activities and work completed by the SCBBO in the State Fiscal Year of 2025 (July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025).

Over the past fiscal year, the SCBBO made significant strategic investments to advance broadband access across the state. The SCBBO focused on developing new broadband grant programs and monitoring existing initiatives to maximize the impact of investments and expand broadband infrastructure to South Carolinians. Project specifics are detailed in the appendix.

State Managed Investments

Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program

The SCBBO continued to develop the grant program to manage BEAD federal funding. The BEAD program was established under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and is administered by the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) within the U.S. Department of Commerce.



During the fiscal year, the SCBBO received NTIA approval for its Initial Proposal Volume II and completed the BEAD Challenge process, confirming 34,443 federally eligible Broadband Serviceable Locations (BSLs). While awaiting further federal guidance, the SCBBO launched the BEAD Eligibility Cleanup (BEC) phase to ensure funding is directed only to unserved and underserved areas. As part of this effort, BSLs verified as

already served or identified as non-serviceable structures — such as sheds, park shelters, or similar locations not requiring broadband access — were removed from the eligibility map to support timely and fiscally responsible deployment.

In June, anticipated federal guidance was issued from the NTIA in the form of the BEAD Restructuring Policy Notice. In response, the SCBBO redesigned the state's grant program to align with updated

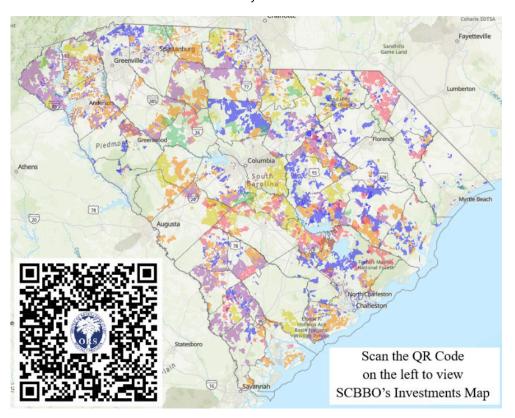
requirements and continued progress toward program launch.

At the conclusion of the BEC Phase, the SCBBO determined that 20,480 locations remain eligible for BEAD funding. The SCBBO Final Proposal recommends the use of funding to connect all remaining BEAD-eligible unserved and underserved locations across the state. The SCBBO anticipates launching the BEAD grant program's application phase during the fall of 2025.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

The SCBBO funded 129 broadband projects using ARPA funds, awarding \$391,464,913 (99.8%) for infrastructure and less than 1% for noninfrastructure expenses. Combined with \$266,383,272 in private-sector match, these projects resulted in an estimated \$664,950,103 in broadband infrastructure investment across South Carolina, reflecting a 40.1% overall match rate from non-ARPA funds, including other federal and private investments. The last ARPA agreement was signed on December 2, 2024. Throughout the program's lifespan, various amendments have been executed to adjust project scope and redistribute unused funds. During the fiscal year, 61 amendments added a net 3,503 eligible locations across projects requiring no additional ARPA funding. The amendments allowed those locations to receive broadband access in a more expeditious and cost-effective manner than funding the same locations through the SC BEAD program. From July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, 38 ARPA-funded broadband projects were successfully closed. In total, 60 of the 129 awarded ARPA projects have been formally closed. These completed projects have resulted in broadband access to 43,545 locations statewide.

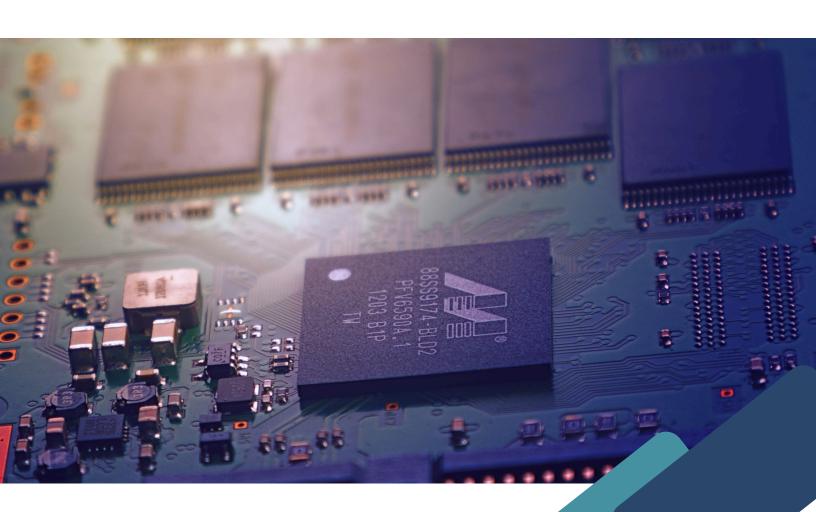


Rural Broadband Grant Program (RBGP)

Remaining funds from the RBGP funding were used to expand three broadband deployment projects to provide access to unserved and underserved BSLs. These projects are scheduled for completion by December 31, 2025.

Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act II)

Remaining funds from the CARES Act were used to award additional broadband deployment projects to provide access to unserved and underserved BSLs. These projects are scheduled for completion by June 30, 2026.



State-Based Legislative Recommendations

The South Carolina Broadband Office appreciates the support it has received from the General Assembly. At this point, the SCBBO has no additional recommendations to present regarding legislative, regulatory, or governmental actions to promote broadband access. The SCBBO will continue to engage stakeholders and monitor implementation challenges as projects progress.

Conclusion

Over the next year, the SCBBO will continue managing ongoing projects and prepare to launch the SC BEAD Program, which currently serves as its final broadband deployment grant initiative to expand reliable internet access to all remaining unserved and underserved eligible locations in the state. With the support of state leadership, the SCBBO has made great strides towards closing the digital divide, working in lockstep with ISPs across the state. This success would not be possible without the state leadership's support and encouragement. The investments made today will serve South Carolinians by providing a world-class communications network designed and engineered to meet the needs of consumers and industry for years to come.
