- 1) Describe Applicant's and/or project Partner's experience building and/or operating broadband networks.

In 2020, Aiken Electric Cooperative received funding from the CARES Act in order to build the broadband infrastructure and provide Wi-Fi to local schools in Aiken and Orangeburg counties. Aiken Electric has also installed over 250 miles of 288 fiber count backbone with a plan to install an additional 350 miles of 288 fiber to be ready to add residential customers by June 2021 to unserved and underserved in our service territory. By partnering with CarolinaConnect which was formed in 2016, we have significant experience operating the fiber-optic network for our members and provide affordable high-speed internet.

- 2) Describe how your proposal meets the needs of the community to be served as described in the "Guidelines."

With the majority of our members residing in unserved or underserved areas, the Rural Broadband Grant will help us achieve our goal of empowering communities by providing high-speed internet that grants greater access to education, technology, conferencing and more. AEC will have the ability to offer 1GB of speed to our consumers which will enhance their daily lives.

As referenced above, our Wi-Fi installation project for the schools was successful since students were able to learn virtually in this unprecedented year. We have statements from several school officials including Dr. Shawn Foster, Superintendent of Orangeburg County School District, "We appreciate Aiken Electric Cooperative for reaching out to us to discuss how their fiber infrastructure upgrade, if planned in collaboration with our school district, could also serve to increase wireless internet access for many of Orangeburg's students. Having additional access points help ease internet connectivity challenges for all students and families, which is especially critical as we continue teaching and learning amidst the coronavirus pandemic."

To whom it may concern:

I am delighted to be writing in support of Aiken Electric Cooperative's (AEC) application for the Rural Broadband Grant Program. As a County Administrator, I am concerned about lingering generational poverty and the lack of adequate internet access in our county. We support AEC and its partner, Carolina Connect, because of their effective and efficient use of funds, as well as the measurable outcomes and impact their internet service will provide.

The majority of AEC's members reside in underserved rural areas lacking adequate internet service or having none at all. Through the Rural Broadband Grant Program, internet speeds of up to 100/20 Mbps will be provided to residents and businesses throughout Aiken, Orangeburg, Barnwell and Calhoun Counties. Additionally, high-speed internet will be provided to essential facilities that contribute to the well-being of these counties, including emergency response, medical, emergency shelters, lifelines, transportation, telecommunications, computer centers, financial institutions, major industrial/commercial, and other related services.

It is noteworthy that this investment will enable the construction of a high-speed, active Ethernet fiber-optic network that allows AEC (and its affiliates) to offer voice, video, and data services to households and businesses in four counties. This technology will also create opportunities to access economic development, health care, educational, and quality of life resources.

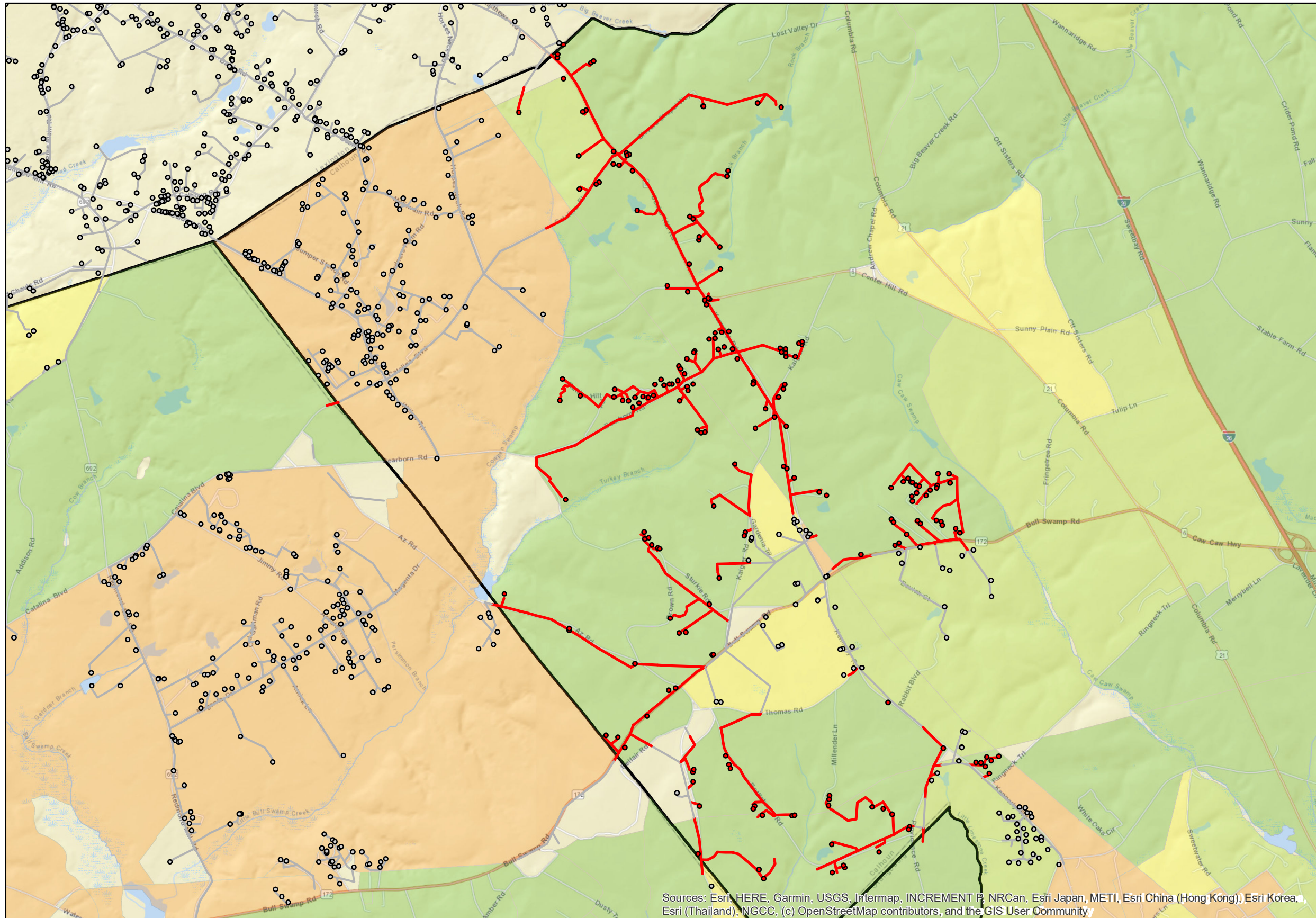
Receiving this grant will give Aiken Electric Cooperative and Carolina Connect the ability to expand the impact made in our community and enhance the quality of life for individuals in need.
