Many of the project areas proposed by Comcast within Berkeley County are either served or in the process of being served by Home Telecom as part of the USDA's ReConnect Project or the ORS' South Carolina Rural Broadband Grant Program. Construction in these proposed census blocks under the ReConnect project is well underway. The ReConnect project will see the majority of residents within these census blocks connected with fiber-to-the-home broadband by the end of 2023, and Home expects the project will be fully complete by the end of 2024. Construction under the South Carolina Rural Broadband Grant is complete.

In addition to these census blocks, Home identified multiple areas within Comcast's SFRF application that already meet the definition of served. Some of these census blocks include ones that are not only served by Home, but in some areas, by multiple providers as well. The attached map, labeled as Exhibit A, demonstrates the census blocks funded by the ReConnect and ORS grant projects and census blocks that meet the definition of served compared to Comcast's SFRF application. Shapefiles can be provided upon request.

Between areas currently served by Home and Home's ongoing broadband grant projects, over 80% of the census blocks within Comcast's proposal are already either sufficiently served or will be served by the above-mentioned timeline. The approval of Comcast's application for these census blocks means multiple areas will be overbuilt with funding that could be used in other unserved areas of rural South Carolina.
